## First County Bank Summer Concert Series free entertainment at Calf Pasture Beach

On Wednesday, July 21, "Back To The Garden 1969" will transport its audience back to the Woodstock era as the band performs classics made famous by musicians who rocked the world during the historic gathering of 500,000 people and 32 musical acts in upstate New York. The free performance at Calf Pasture Beach will begin at 7:00 p.m. and is part of the First County Bank Summer Concert Series. Attendees are encouraged to bring a picnic and comfortable seating. A parking fee of \$5.00 per car will be charged for cars without a Norwalk beach sticker.

Widely regarded as one of the greatest and most pivotal moments in popular music history, the Woodstock Music and Art Fair is listed among Rolling Stone's "50 Moments That Changed the History of Rock and Roll." The festival was held from August 15-18, 1969, on a farm in upstate New York . This peaceful gathering of 500,000 people who saw 32 musical performances became an idea that suffused American culture, politically and socially, as much as musically.

Formed in 2009 for the Woodstock Festival's 40th anniversary by former Norwalk resident Gary Adamson, the Back To The Garden's performances are a celebration of the music and history of the Woodstock Era. The seasoned musicians in this tribute band have toured, performed and recorded nationally. Each member of the band – Adamson, Bob Fonseca, Mike Garner, Larry Kelly and Annie Masciando -- plays multiple instruments and also is a lead vocalist.

The July 21 concert will include music made famous by Woodstock performers like Joe Cocker, Janis Joplin, Blood, Sweat and Tears, Jimi Hendrix, Sly and The Family Stone, Richie Havens, The Grateful Dead, Arlo Guthrie, Jefferson Airplane, Creedence Clearwater Revival, The Who, and Crosby , Stills, Nash and Young.
